2. Right-side up people respond with perception, partnership and <u>prayer</u>

3. When God provides what you need, give Him the credit

Daniel 2:24-49

Daniel didn't go looking for a challenge that day, but he did know **where** to go when it came to him.

Why are difficult situations times when we learn about God? (Daniel's and our own)

How does Daniel demonstrate kinship and partnership with the fellow believers in his 'small group?' How might this apply to us today?

What does this story encourage in your own life?



Daniel urged his friends to pray. He also told the king that "there is a God in heaven." Let's share and pray with our friends.

- Are you facing a difficult situation? Is there something only God can do?
- Who is someone in your world that you know needs God?
- Where do you need God's wisdom? Is God asking you to grow in some way?
