What do you notice about the king's attitude and thoughts? What was the final "straw" that caused him to be dethroned?

How do you see God's leadership and grace?

What were the king's final actions and conclusions?

What can we learn from the journey of the king? Are there points of connection for us today?

How is the influence of the Jewish believers seen in this chapter? What might we learn about influence in our worlds?
