When you understand who Jesus is, you prioritize sitting at His feet

1. Jesus valued <u>women</u> and invited them to follow Him

Luke 10:38-39

Acts 22:3

Women weren't allowed that kind of access to rabbis and weren't afforded the option of being "<u>disciples</u>" in any context.

2. You question Jesus' <u>care</u> when you're pursuing your own agenda rather than His

1 Peter 5:7

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Who's in your home, Martha?

You don't make the decision to follow Jesus and then expect Him to follow **you**.

3. Jesus knows that being with Him is what we need \underline{most}

Luke 10:41-42

1 Peter 5:7 Cast all your **anxiety** on him because he cares for you.

Jesus is not only who I need the most, but who the people in my **relational world** need the most.
