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Home Group Notes Week of April 26, 2020 "A People Prepared" 1 Peter 2:4-10



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Do you remember times when you couldn't wait to share some good news? (e.g. When my wife, Diane, agreed to marry me!) How did it roll out?

LEARN FROM THE WORD Read through 1 Peter 2:4-10. How are those who belong to God described?

What is God doing in the lives of those who belong to Him? What status or blessings has He bestowed on those who belong to Him? (See if you can list five of them.) What is the significance of each of these?

What do we learn about the privilege of what it means to be "a holy priesthood" from Hebrews 4:16 and 10:19-22?

The opening words, "As you come" or "And coming to Him" is used of drawing near to God. What helps us draw near to God? What have we seen in 1 Peter thus far?

DISCUSSION TOGETHER Peter listed multiple privileges and blessings of those who belong to God. What are they and how are they significant? What does it mean to you that you are "precious" to God? What does this teach us about God and our relationship with Him? This passage speaks about people in our world who are currently destined for "shame" (i.e. people who are for now unconvinced or unbelieving). According to verses 9-10, what is our role in their lives?
