Have you been in a place where others were jealous of you or you of others?



Genesis is the "beginnings" of God's master plan to include people in His blessings. Jacob was chosen by God to become a nation to make God known to the world. However, as this story shows, mankind has a sin problem. Read Genesis 37:1-36.

What do we learn about the character of the people that God chose to build a nation?

What did Joseph (17) do that demonstrated a desire to be faithful to his father?

Joseph was the firstborn of Jacob's wife of choosing. How was this demonstrated by Jacob?

How did the dreams portray Joseph's destiny? How did his brothers respond?

What do we learn about God's sovereign plans? How did the brothers respond?
